The admission procedure is completely online and it follows the rules and regulations laid down by the BANGLAR UCHCHASHIKSHA, Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal and the University of Calcutta **vide Ref. No. CUS/91{Cir.}/22, Date: 04<sup>th</sup> July, 2022.** Further, the admission is strictly based on Merit list published by the college authority.

A candidate, willing to take admission to the under-graduate degree course in 2022-2023 session shall have to pursue semester-wise three years course under CBCS as per C.U. regulations vide notification

**(ref. no : CUS/268 (Cir)/18, dated 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2018).**

A candidate pursuing a regular course of study for three years semester-wise degree course shall have to clear all the semesters in all respects within a span of 5 years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand

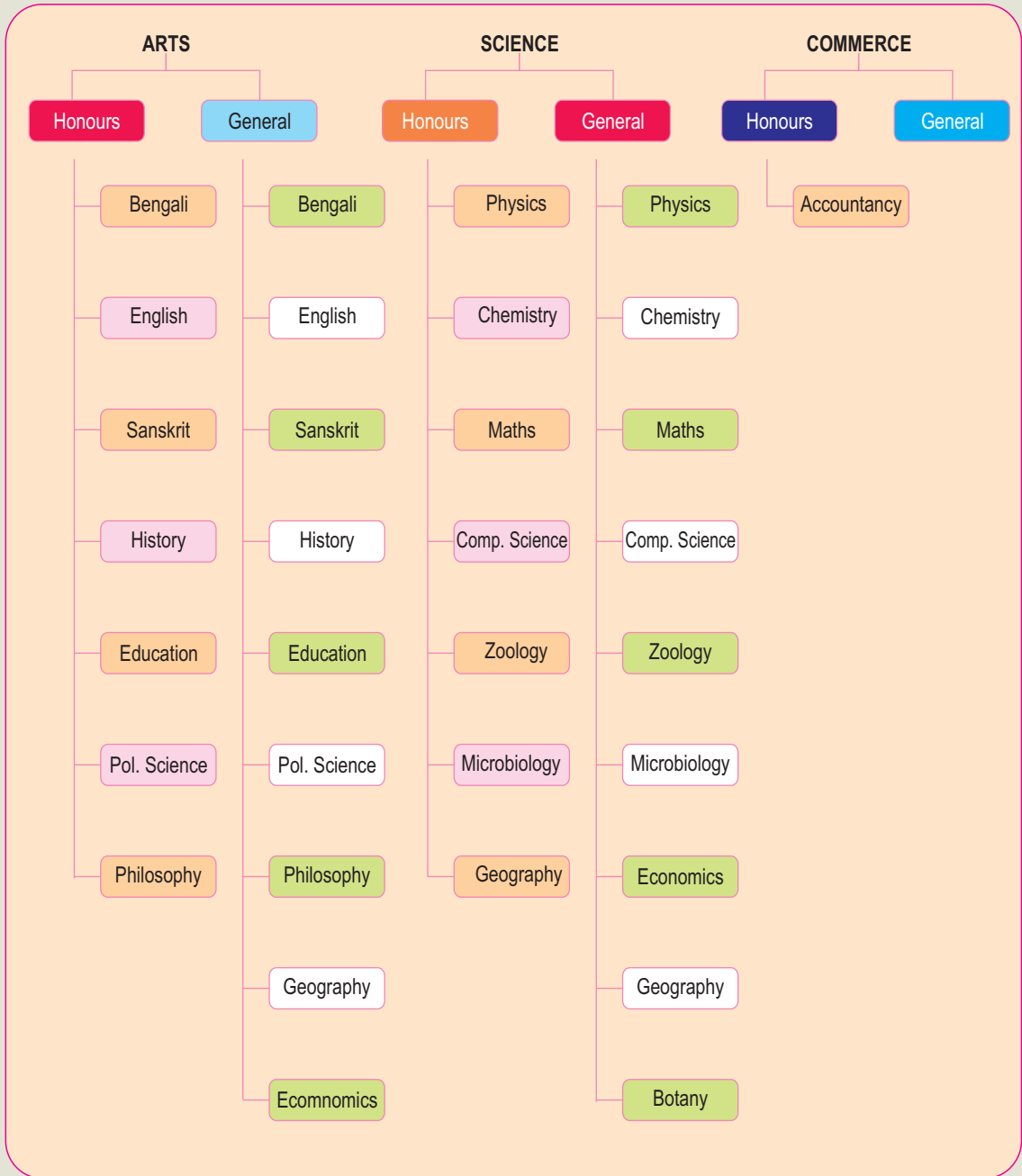

## COLLEGE RULES

**Automation:** Automation of the library using Koha (Integrated Library Management Software) is in full swing and RFID system has been installed. We also provide WEB-OPAC service to our users. The Central Library is the member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly content, Gandhinagar) and DELNET (Developing Library Network, New Delhi) for e-resource access.

**P.C. CHANDRA KNOWLEDGE CENTRE :** Sammilani Mahavidyalaya received a grant of Rs. 2 lacs from the P. C. Chandra Group under the scheme of 'Gyandhara Prakaalpa' for up gradation of the library of the college. Utilizing the grant, 'P.C. Chandra Knowledge Centre' was established with an objective of helping our students and alumni in pursuing their career. A separate room was renovated for the purpose. Books on career guidance, necessary furniture, two computers and other accessories were purchased.
